The Bunker at Greenbrier

The tour of the declassified Bunker at the Greenbrier takes you behind the scenes and walks you through a fascinating period in the resort's history. Built in the late 1950's by the US Government, this facility served as the emergency relocation center for the US Congress in the event of a national crisis and was maintained at a constant state of readiness until its discovery in 1992. Cranberry Mountain Nature Center and Cranberry Glades Botanical Area

Cranberry Mountain Nature Center has nature displays, interpretive gardens and trails, live reptiles, and a nature store. Cranberry Glades Botanical Area contains the largest area of bogs in West Virginia whose unique plant and animal life, including orchids and insect eating plants, is similar to wetlands found in Canada. Carnegie Hall

Carnegie Hall in Lewisburg is one of only four Carnegies in the world and operates as a regional center for the visual and performing arts. Two tours are offered to this location. The first tour includes a presentation on the history of the hall and a tour of the galleries. The second tour includes a visit to the pottery, art, weaving, and dance studios. Cass Scenic Railroad to Bald Knob

The Cass Scenic Railroad was built in 1901 to haul lumber to the mill in Cass. The locomotives are the same ones used during that time. At an elevation of 4,842 feet, Bald Knob is the third highest point in West Virginia. Located 11 miles up the mountain from Cass, the Bald Knob overlook offers spectacular views (on a clear day) into two states and into the valley below, home to the National Radio Astronomy Observatory. Includes a "King of the Road" Hobo Lunch.

The second trip is to Whittaker Station and back. Whittaker Station is located four miles up the track from Cass and the excursion includes two switchbacks. There is a 30-minute layover at Whittaker Station, the location of the authentic logging camp recreated by the volunteers of the Mountain State Railroad & Logging Historical Association.
